



Do you seek out meat, eggs, and dairy items with labels pertaining to "animal welfare"? Well, buyer, beware!

Turkeys kicked and hit with an iron rod. Pigs with bloody prolapses the size of oranges and no veterinary care. Workers simulating sexual acts on turkeys. All this and more was documented

(including videotaped) on what were basically factory farms certified as humane by the Global Animal Partnership (G.A.P.), on whose board the Humane Society of the United States (HSUS) and the American Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals (ASPCA) "proudly" serve.

The farms are off-limits to the buying public, but PETA investigators have documented widespread and systemic cruelty and suffering at all 12 G.A.P.-certified facilities they've gone inside. PETA's investigation into Plainville Farms, then G.A.P.-approved, resulted in the largest number of cruelty charges in any factory-farm case, with 10 workers convicted so far.

The HSUS and the ASPCA are apologists for some of the most deceptive meat, egg, and dairy factory farms by giving their stamp of approval to the animal "products" that come from them, masking cruelty with happy-looking marketing campaigns and deceitful certifications. This makes the HSUS and the ASPCA active promoters of animal abusers.
